Orlando Guerra and Damon Lewis won Lone Star Circuit Homebrew Team of the Year. They also won two first place medals at the NHC in Oakland as well as first runner-up in the Best of Show for NHC. That is second best beer of over 5,000 entries. That is really a great accomplishment that the whole

club should be proud of. As part of their prize they got to go to Sierra Nevada Brewing for a weekend with other winners and brewed a baltic porter on their system.

As I transition from treasurer to president I want to let you know that the treasurer position is a lot more work than I thought it was. We have five new officers this year and one officer returning after taking a few years off. The 2010 Competition Director(1st VP) is Scott Townson. Scott lives in Hurst but still manages to attend almost all of our meetings and brewdays. 
Third: The Bluebonnet deadline is quickly approaching only a mere month later on February the 24th.

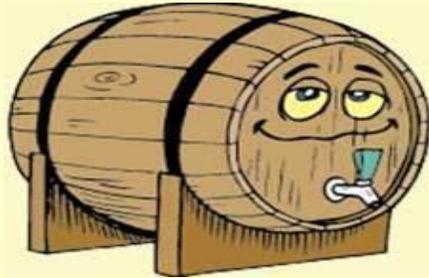
