We do have 80 members that have membership expiring in 2016. Thanks for renewing your membership.



Beer Stuff

I got my 10 PCBs from dirtypcb.com. They came in while I was at NHC. I have not had a chance to build one up yet because I had some higher priority tasks in front of BrewPi. I did find a mistake in the board design that I can fix with a wire. Overall I think the boards look great. Worth the wait and the price.

The big reason for ordering these boards was I really wanted to see what a board would look like after I designed it and it was manufactured. I'll spend more time refining the Brewtroller board I am going to design as a shield for the Arduino Mega2560.

Below is a picture of one of the boards I got back. I will cut it into four smaller boards along the white line. The two sub boards on the right side are different versions of the rotary encoder board with different spacing on the mounting holes for the encoder. I was not sure what the proper spacing was. I was surprised that the board house would do the notches you see on the sides of the board. Those were experiments just to see what would happen. You can also see an imperfection on the left side of the sharpie circle. Those two marks have the resist scraped off. Not a big deal, just an imperfection I can live with for the price.



National Homebrew Conference

NHC was very fun. I think we went out too early. We arrived on Saturday before the event week. We went to so many breweries and bars that I was a bit beered out by the time NHC started.

We went to the Brewing Network's 10th anniversary party on the Wednesday night. It was a great party with many awesome beers pouring. Amazingly there was so much good beer that there was not a line at the Russian River station. The Rare Barrel was pouring all of their beers and had a huge line. I did not wait in that line preferring to taste the other good beers at the party.

They were actually very good. The wore work suits with skeleton masks and fezzes.

NHC talks started slow for me but finished with some great talks. I am inspired to brew some sour beers now. The beer events were too crowded because outdoor space was just not big enough for the number of people attending. The beer at commercial night was very good. I though the beer at homebrew night was some of the worst I have had at a NHC. I only liked about 10% of the beers I tasted. Some of this may have been the fact that I was burned out on hoppy beers by then and was looking for some good Porters, Pilsners and anything sessionable.

NHC will be in Baltimore next year. I don't know what the beer scene is like in Maryland. It will be close to some of the Pennsylvania breweries so there will be some options.
