The Treasure's Report By Jimmy Orkin

Summary:

We had two big expenses that hit our books in April. We had the charges for the pizzas at the April club meet at the Franconia Brewery and the down payment for the venue for the Holiday party in December.

Many current club memberships will expire on May 31. New renewals have a May 31, 2015 expiration date and cost \$30. The homebrew stores have the new cards. I also have new membership cards and applications with me at all club events. I apologize for not have the forms and cards on the Spring Party.

On June 1, I will purge the old email list. Only current members will receive the newsletter and club email messages. Don't let your name drop off our mail list. Renew your membership now.

I will now write about my brewing activities last month. I bought a BrewBit (<u>brewbit.com</u>) Model-T temperature controller as part of a Kickstarter. It looked promising and I liked the form factor and the promised functions of the controller.

Below is an image of the unit:



I like the screen layout. It is Wi-Fi enabled and connects to the BrewBit website. It is a dual controller in the fact that it has two temperature probes and two power outlets. Each outlet can be driven by temperature input in either a heating or cooling mode. Static temperature or ramp profiles can be built in the website. The controller can work in simple on/off or PID mode. This image below from the website shows a couple of days of data from my unit. I have the unit controlling a light bulb with a sensor in top of the bulb. The two fuzzy periods show when the light was actually controlled. The other time the bulb was unplugged and the sensor was just showing the room temperature. The blue line shows the setpoint ramp up and down.



It is open hardware and software so the community can enhance the device. I have ordered the programming adapter needed to program the Model-T locally. The Model-T has several bugs currently. The guys that built the Model-T are working to fix the problems. I don't trust it yet but it looks very promising for mash and fermentation temperature control.

I am glad to talk about it and if there is interest, I can bring it to a club event and demo the unit.
