

Ah, summer time. Hot as blazes out there. It's a tough time to brew but a great time for a road trip. Where to? Austin! Your club officers have been working the details and now we're ready to lay the plan out.

We'll tour the Celis brewery and visit the best brewpubs and multi-tap bars in Austin. Places we'll be visiting include Waterloo Brewing Company, Live Oak Brewing Company, Draught Horse, Lovejoy's, and The Bitter End. Lynne O'Connor has promised to have something good on tap when we stop at St. Patrick's.

We'll travel in air-conditioned comfort in a decked-out 15 passenger van. Maybe two, depending on how many folks come along. We'll leave Dallas at 9:00 am Saturday, August 19 and return Sunday afternoon. I have volunteered to be your designated driver.

Your transportation cost will be exactly your share of the expense. The club won't be making or losing a dime here. Based on the quoted van rental rates and some reasonable assumptions for miles driven, miles per gallon, and fuel price, we estimate that transportation will range between \$59 (for six people, one van) to

\$24 (15 people, one van) to \$44 (16 people, two vans) to \$24 (30 people, two vans). We are asking for a deposit of \$45, paid in advance. As soon as we get back to Dallas we'll add up the expenses and either collect the difference or refund the surplus. \$45 dollars should be more than enough unless the turnout is under 8. Heck, if its 6 or less I'll take my Expedition.

We've also been checking into hotel rates. So far, the best deal we have found is at the Ramada Airport North, about 4 miles from downtown Austin. They have a group rate of \$45 for a room with two full beds. In order to qualify for this group rate we need to book at least ten rooms with one call. They also have a special rate right now of \$50 for the same room without the group requirement but that offer is subject to change at any time. The regular price is \$75 without the discounts. I'm asking for your help in getting firm commitments (paid transportation deposits and room count) by August 8 so that we know in advance of the trip if we can get the group rate. August 8 is a club meeting night, and that is the deadline.

Yes, there are a few details left to work out. I'll have more details, such as an hour-by-hour schedule and the address of our Dallas departure point in the next newsletter. Make your plans now. **This is gonna be some fun!**


